

<u>Food Pantry:</u> We have seen a big influx of people who need food and personal care items to help them get through the weeks ahead. We ask that any food items you bring be nonperishable and that the dates on the items are current and not expired. Items that are needed are crackers (any kind), pancake mixes (add water), chunky soups, stews, chili, pasta sides, pickles (any kind), jelly or jam, oatmeal, and canned meats. We welcome any other items that you can donate. Also much needed are the large handled grocery bags. Personal care items needed are men's shavers, body wash (especially for men), and deodorants. Supplies such as Kleenex, dish soap, liquid hand soap, laundry detergent, and aluminum foil are also needed. Thank you for your generosity and support. We have a wonderful team of dedicated volunteers who are touched and blessed by the people we meet.

**Book Discussion Group:** On Monday, November 20, at 1:30 pm the group will discuss the book: **Nevertheless: American Methodists and Women's Rights** by Ashley Boggan Dreff.

This book tells the story of American Methodist women's efforts to fight for women's rights, beginning with the Women's Christian Temperance Union and ending with the #MeToo movement. Each chapter documents particular Methodist women and provides the reader with a basic historical context of the time or situation at hand as it shows how Methodist women engaged and fought for women's equality or women's rights in American society and American Methodism. The faith of these Methodist women emboldened them to reach beyond their social confines to find political avenues of social justice. As women engaged in missions, they sought to not simply fix social ills but to prevent them from happening again. They addressed the causes of oppression and, by stepping out of their place, made a place for others. The group meets in The Bernice Nailen Memorial Library. All are welcome.






