From the Pastor's Desk

Members & Friends of FUMCWA,

The month of May is upon us, which means we *should* be able to put the snow shovels away and get ready for summer. The month of May this year also hosts the celebration of the feast of Pentecost - often called the "birthday of the Church."

If you define "church" as an organized body of believers, I suppose the Pentecost event *may* count as its birthday, but there clearly was a body of believers prior to Jesus' crucifixion. Similarly, a solid argument could be made that even with the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, those early "believers" were not too well organized.

Yet, something powerful and life-changing did occur that day as those followers were huddled in that room. What happened is that they burst forth under the influence of the Holy Spirit to invite others to join them on a journey to change the world. That clearly was something—the "birth" of a movement that is still alive today.

When I first arrived here at First UMCWA, my attention was immediately directed to an impressive booklet entitled: "Celebrating 100 Years of Worship, Fellowship, and Service in the Heart of the Community." So, I paged through it. However, I was drawn to read it again as I pondered Pentecost - the birthday of the Christian church. I did so because this document delightfully celebrated the years of life and service that this church has experienced. The Spirit has been alive here!

Having just had a birthday in April (thanks to all who so graciously made it special), I was reminded that with each birthday comes the recognition that nothing stays the same - change is the only unchanging thing. And, it's been said that an essential trait a person needs to age well is an openness to change - you'd have to in order to accumulate birthdays with any degree of grace. So, while change may be unexpected, uncontrollable, and uncomfortable, it also is the only way to engage with life and grow.

And that is one of the many, many things I have grown to appreciate here. While this congregation has many wonderful traditions and "ways we've always done things," as well as its rich history of doing a wide variety of ministries, missions, programs, and initiatives, there still remains a healthy sense of "Sure, we could try that!" This is a gift that is often underrated, but it is the key to vitality. It's proof that you're alive and determined to thrive.

May 12, 2024 The Ascension

<u>Text</u>: Acts 1:1-11, John 14:26 <u>Hymn</u>: TFWS # 2117 *"Spirit of God"* <u>Title</u>: *"Left Standing"* The disciples were seemingly "left standing" when Jesus ascended into the skies, but even if they didn't know it at the time they were not alone.

May 19, 2024 Pentecost Sunday

<u>Text</u>: Acts 2:1-21 <u>Hymn</u>: UMH # 393 *"Spirit of the Living God"* <u>Title</u>: *"Sparks Went Flying"* Apprehensively waiting, the disciples were transformed and inspired by the coming of the Holy Spirit and moved to launch the Church.

May 26, 2024 Trinity Sunday (Memorial Day)

<u>Text</u>: 1 Corinthians 12:1-11 <u>Hymn</u>: UMH # 336 *"Of All the Spirit's Gifts to Me"* <u>Title</u>: *"The Whole Is Greater"* The Holy Spirit is the element of the Trinity which, though "unseen", is experienced most powerfully through the expression of It's gifts in our lives.

UNITED WOMEN IN FAITH (UWIF): On April 8th, Unity Circle invited Sojourner Family Peace Center to provide us with information about their organization. Our presenter, Lindsay, was amazing and we were so moved by all that they do. They served about 10,000 women this last year and expect those numbers to rise this year. One in four women will experience domestic violence in their lifetime. One in ten men will experience domestic violence. A person is 99.836% more likely to survive domestic violence if they connect with Sojourner. The primary goal is to ensure the safety of people experiencing domestic violence. They work to provide a pathway to peace for survivors and abusers through opportunities to make positive and lasting changes for themselves and their children. Thirteen co-located partners make it possible for survivors to access an array of services under one roof to achieve safety, healing, and well-being. If you would like to help with this great or-



As the book asserts, people can and do escape high conflict. Individuals and entire communities can short-circuit the feedback loops of outrage and blame if they want to.
